

RJS SYLLABUS 2025

The Rajasthan High Court has announced the opening for a Junior Division Civil Judge in Rajasthan. This notification represents an excellent opportunity for eligible candidates to become Rajasthan Civil Judges.

Before applying for this position, candidates should carefully read the Rajasthan High Court's notification as it contains all the information they need to know about the recruiting process, chiefly the RJS Syllabus 2025.

Rajasthan Judiciary Syllabus 2025: Examination Pattern

Three sections make up the RJS Examination pattern. According to the RJS Exam Pattern, the final merit list will be created and the applicants will be chosen based on their combined results from the Main Exam and the Interview. They are as follows:

- **Preliminary Examination:** The RJS examination begins with this phase. Multiple choice questions make up this exam, which must be completed in order to advance to the mains examination, the second level.
- **Mains Examination:** This is the RJS Examination's second phase. Candidates who complete the RJS preliminary test are eligible to take the RJS judiciary mains exam. The majority of the exam consists of subjective or narrative-style questions.
- **Interview:** This is the final and third round of the RJS Examination selection process. A candidate advances to this level if they are eligible for the RJS mains exam. It is likely that the questions are not so much philosophical as they are generic.

RJS Syllabus 2025

The three components of the new RJS Syllabus 2025 for the Civil Judge Cadre examination are the following:

- Objective-Type Preliminary Examination;
- Subjective-Type Written Main Examination; and
- Interview

Rajasthan Judiciary Syllabus 2025

Preliminary Examination:

- The preliminary exam is conducted in the objective type. 15% of the total weight going toward testing language proficiency in Hindi and English, and 70% of the total weight going toward the subjects included in the Law Paper syllabus.
- There is going to be a maximum of 100 questions on the preliminary examination, with a maximum score of 100.
- There will be no deduction of marks for wrong answers on the preliminary exam.
- The examination is taken two hours to get complete.
- The marks obtained in the preliminary examination will not be used to determine the final merit.

Examination for the Interview:

- Candidates from the general category must receive at least 35% in each of the law papers and 40% overall in the Main Examination in order to advance to the interview process.
- Candidates from the reserved category will receive 30% of the possible points in each of the law papers and a total of 35% in the main examination.
- The whole LLB course, as well as current affairs, historical information, and legal and social norms, will all be incorporated into the interview questions.
- The candidates' familiarity with the state of Rajasthan will also be assessed.
- In general, the candidate's personality, communication abilities, general awareness, and leadership abilities are what matter most during the interview phase.
