Gujarat judiciary Syllabus 2025: Pattern of the Examination

Three stages make up the GJS examination, which evaluates candidates' knowledge, abilities, and fitness for the judicial service.

- **The Preliminary Examination:** The GJS exam begins with this phase. It's an objective assessment that serves as a screening tool. The preparatory exam evaluates a candidate's Gujarati language skills, legal topic knowledge, and current events awareness.
- **The Mains Examination:** Individuals who pass the preliminary exam advance to the Mains. The Mains assessment is more in-depth and personal. It assesses a candidate's ability to do legal analysis, familiarity with procedural laws, and understanding of various laws.
- **The Interview Round:** Following their performance in the Mains exam, candidates are invited to a personal interview, or viva voce. The candidate's demeanour, legal acumen, and fitness for the judiciary are assessed by the interview panel.

Gujarat judiciary exam syllabus 2025: Pattern of the Examination in Details

Preliminary Examination:

- It carries questions that are objective in nature
- The total no of questions rounds up to 100
- These questions carry one mark each
- It carries a negative marking of 0.33 marks for every wrong response
- The candidates with need two hours to complete this exam
- The minimum qualifying marks for this examination are 50%

Mains Examination:

- It carries questions that are Subjective in nature
- In the GJS mains examination, there are total of 3 papers
- The Paper I is of Criminal Law that carries 75 marks and has to be completed within 150 minutes

- The Paper II is of Civil Law that carries 75 marks and has to be completed within 150 minutes
- The Paper III is of Gujarati Language that carries 50 marks and has to be completed within 90 minutes

Interview Round:

- This is the final component of the examination, which measures the applicant's aptitude, and depth of knowledge as well as their communication skills, attitudes, ethics, and judgmental equilibrium.
- The minimum score required to advance to the next round is 40%.

2. Is Gujarati mandatory for the Gujarat judiciary exam?

It requires a bachelor's degree in law to sit for the Gujarat Judicial Services test. It must be from an Indian university that has been legally acknowledged. Gujarati Language Proficiency: To be considered, candidates must be able to speak and understand Gujarati.

3. What is the passing marks for Gujarat judiciary exam?

Three phases comprise the selection process: main exam, viva-voce, and preliminary exam.
