The Haryana Civil Judge Junior Division Exam is the official name of the Haryana Judicial Services Examination. This article is designed to help you know about the Haryana judiciary syllabus 2025 in details. The Haryana Public Service Commission (PSC) administers this exam on behalf of the Haryana High Court in order to fill the positions of Judicial Magistrate and Civil Judge Junior Division in the cadre of the Haryana Civil Service.

Haryana judiciary syllabus 2025: Stages of the Examination

- **Preliminary Examination:** The Haryana Judiciary Preliminary Exam assesses your conceptual comprehension and legal knowledge. To pass prelims, you must concentrate on the essential acts and sections.
- **Mains Examination:** The Mains Exam measures each candidate's breadth of legal knowledge and comprehension. To pass this level, you should be familiar with all the ideas, case laws, and amendments. To improve your score, you should make sure to focus on your writing skills.
- **Interview Round:** Your communication skills, demeanour, and manner are assessed during the interview. Your ability to sell yourself as a worthy candidate will determine how successful you are at this stage.

Haryana judiciary syllabus 2025: Preliminary Examination

- The Haryana judiciary preliminary exam is qualifying in nature
- It carries all Objective type questions
- There are a total number of 125 questions
- The candidate is rewarded with 4 marks for each correct answer
- The candidate gets 1/5 negative marking for every incorrect answer
- The Minimum qualifying marks for this preliminary exam are 150 marks
- The duration of this examination is for 2 hours

Haryana judicial services syllabus 2025: Mains Examination

- This Haryana judiciary mains examination is subjective in nature
- It contains total of 5 papers
- There are 3 Law papers and there are 2 Language papers in this mains exam
- It carries a total mark for all papers that totals up to 900
- The medium of Haryana judiciary exam is English except the Hindi language paper
- The duration of this exam is for 3 hours for each individual paper

Haryana judicial services syllabus 2025: Interview Round

- This is the last stage of the examination and the selection process.
- The Haryana judiciary interview carries a total mark of 100.
- This exam is conducted to check the overall personality and knowledge of the candidate.

Haryana judiciary exam syllabus 2025: Preliminary Examination

- It is identical to the preliminary exams. There will be objective questions based on the Acts examined in the main examination.
- You must concentrate on all of the subjects for the preliminary test; however, give some extra attention to the following: Contracts, Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, CPC, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, Indian Constitution, Transfer of Property Act, etc.
- To stay up to date on current events and legal affairs, read the newspaper every day.

Paper 5: Hindi Language (carrying 100 marks)

- It includes translation of English Passage into Hindi that carries 20 Marks
- It includes Prose writing of Hindi passage that carries 30 Marks
- It also includes Hindi essay, Idioms, & corrections that carries 50 Marks

Haryana judiciary exam syllabus 2025: Interview Round

- A candidate needs to receive at least 50% of the possible points in all of their Mains written exams in order to be eligible for viva voce.
- However, a minimum of 45% of the total possible points must be earned in order to qualify for applicants who belong to the SCs and STs, Backward Classes, Physically Handicapped, as well as Ex-Serviceman (ESM) candidates only (but not their dependents).
- There will only be one English interview.
- The purpose of the interview is to evaluate the candidate's character.
- The interview will assess the candidate's broad attitude, intelligence, and awareness on topics of general interest.
- To be considered for the final selection, you must show up for the viva-voce or interview.

The tough and thorough Haryana Judiciary examination assesses a candidate's knowledge, comprehension, and suitability for the position of judicial officer. For this reason, Bare Acts are permitted during the primary exam. The curriculum includes instruction in English language, criminal law, and civil law, among other legal topics.
