- The purpose of these interviews is to evaluate candidates' suitability to serve as Uttar Pradesh's civil judges.
- To determine the eligibility of a candidate, they consider factors such as personality, character, and level of physical condition.

upscj exam syllabus 2025: Interview Round

- There will be a 100 marks exam.
- Candidates will be evaluated for employment in the Uttar Pradesh Judicial Service based on their merit, taking into account their skills, character, personality, and physical appearance.

- The candidate's position will be determined by adding the points from the written papers and the interview, and calculating the total of both.
- Any candidate who has not received enough points in the Law Papers to warrant such a denial may be declined an interview by the Commission.

3. How many papers are there in PCS J?

4. What is the syllabus of judiciary?

5. Which state PCS J exam is easy?

7. Is up judiciary held every year?

Yes, the Uttar Pradesh High Court holds the UP PCS J each year.

8. Which state PCs J is easy to crack?

The state judicial services examinations in Delhi, Haryana, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, UP, as well as MP (all in the northern zone) are perceived as being easy because Hindi is an option.

9. How many hours to study for judiciary?

A concentrated study program is necessary to cover all the topics covered in the syllabus and adequately prepare for the judiciary exam. Try to study for at least 10 or 12 hours per day.

10. Is judiciary easier than UPSC?

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) will always be significantly harder for a law graduate to pass than the state judiciary test.

11. Is LLM compulsory for judiciary?

The only requirement to apply for the Judicial Examination is to have an LLB from an approved college. An LLM is not required in order to apply for the judiciary exam. According to the Junior Judge Exam Eligibility, you must be between the ages of 21 and 35 to apply for the judicial services exam.

12. Who is greater than judge?

The President of India appoints the Chief Justice of India, who holds the highest court position in the nation. In addition to overseeing the Supreme Court, the Chief Justice is in charge of running the Indian judicial system as a whole.
